

Global Outreach Training Program:

Trainer Information

GLOBAL OSHA AUTHORIZED TRAINER
Global Occupational Safety and Health Academy, LLC

The Global Outreach Training Program permits occupational safety and health professionals to become authorized as trainers and conduct training for workers in locations worldwide. Through this program, Global OSHA Authorized Trainers conduct introductory and intermediate level classes for workers based on construction safety or general safety. These classes focus on the recognition and avoidance of safety and health hazards in the workplace. Global OSHA issues course completion wallet cards to their students, who can then document the training they receive with a digital badge.

International Reach

The Global Outreach Training Program was created to meet the ongoing demand for high quality occupational safety and health training for workers in locations outside the United States. All Global OSHA programs and courses are available to be conducted worldwide.

Developed by former senior management staff from the OSHA Directorate of Training and Education, the program offers the same hazard recognition topics as the US Department of Labor (USDOL) Outreach Training Program, but with greater flexibility.

Trainer Courses

Trainer courses are 24 contact hours. The authorizations include the following.

- #500 Construction Safety Trainer
- #501 General Safety Trainer

Global OSHA Authorized Trainers may then conduct the #100 series introductory worker course, which is eight hours in length, with training usually completed in one day. Trainers may also conduct the #200 series intermediate course, which is 24 hours in length, with training usually completed in three days.

Key Advantages for Global Program

The Global Outreach Training Program offers key advantages for trainers vs. the USDOL Outreach Training Program.

- Trainers can conduct courses in locations worldwide. (USDOL program limited to US-only)
- Courses can be conducted in one day. (USDOL program minimum 2 days)
- Course completion card issued within 30 days. (USDOL program 90 days)
- Content focused solely on hazard recognition topics. (USDOL program includes policy and legal topics)
- Global OSHA classes include digital badges. (USDOL program does not)

Global Trainer Qualifications

To become a Global OSHA Authorized Trainer, individuals must:

- Demonstrate three years of safety experience within the industry
- Complete an eight-hour trainer prerequisite course #550
- Complete a three-day train-the-trainer course. (Waived for current OSHA outreach trainers)

OSHA Outreach Trainer Equivalency

Trainers currently authorized, and in good standing, through the USDOL Outreach Training Program may qualify for immediate authorization as Global OSHA Authorized Trainers by *completing only the eight-hour prerequisite course #550*. Trainers must provide documentation of current status.

Trainer Course Webinars

To meet the demand for authorized trainers worldwide, Global OSHA now offers trainer courses via live webinar. These are offered in English language and include the following.

- #500 Construction Safety Trainer
- #501 General Safety Trainer

The webinar course is delivered over five days (Monday-Friday), and requires student to develop and deliver a live presentation. Students must pass a written assessment on the course content. Contact hours: 24

Mandatory and Elective Topics

Training topics for worker courses are determined by trade as applicable, and organized by mandatory and elective topics. Maintaining Trainer Authorization

The trainer authorization is valid for four years. An eight-hour, online trainer update course is required every four years in order to maintain trainer authorization.

Course Completion Wallet Cards

Global OSHA issues completion cards wallet cards for many of its courses. This includes all #100 and #200 series courses, as well as all trainer courses. The cards contain an ID photo and a QR code which links to the digital badges earned by the cardholder. This allows the cardholder to provide verification of training history, including specific training topics.

Digital Badges

Global OSHA issues digital badges for all training because it understands the importance of documenting worker knowledge, skills, and training; especially when it comes to occupational safety and health.
