

## Global OSHA Training Centers

*Global OSHA Training Centers are an international network of affiliate training organizations authorized to conduct training on behalf of the Global Occupational Safety and Health Academy. Modeled after the OSHA Training Institute (OTI) Education Center in the United States, these organizations demonstrate advanced experience and proficiency in developing and conducting occupational safety and health curriculum. Global OSHA Training Centers offer instructor-led train-the-trainer courses which enable safety professionals to become Global OSHA Authorized Trainers and conduct training for workers in locations worldwide. Global OSHA Training Centers offer a variety of other instructor-led occupational safety and health courses ranging from one to three days in length. Upon successful completion of these courses, students receive course completion certificates endorsed by the Global Occupational Safety and Health Academy, and a digital badge to document the training.*

### International Reach

The Global OSHA Training Center Program was created to meet the ongoing demand for high quality occupational safety and health training for safety professionals and workers in locations outside the United States.

The program framework was developed by former senior management staff from the OSHA Directorate of Training and Education. The program utilizes the local organization's occupational safety and health expertise to develop and conduct high quality training.

### Course Curriculum

Global OSHA Training Centers conduct occupational safety and health courses based on learning objectives established by Global OSHA. Global OSHA Training Centers utilize their own expertise and resources to develop specific curriculum and training materials applicable to local industry and workplace scenarios. The curriculum addresses occupational safety and health hazard awareness, identification, recognition, avoidance, control, abatement, and prevention in the workplace.

### Program Benefits

Through the Global OSHA Training Centers, workers and safety and health professionals benefit from worldwide access to high quality training developed in coordination with former senior management staff from the OSHA Directorate of Training and Education.

## Course Offerings and Topics

Global OSHA Training Centers conduct the #400 series advanced courses, which are three days in length. Topics include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Fall Hazards/Working at Height
- Electrical Safety
- Machine Guarding
- Industrial Hygiene

Global OSHA Training Centers also conduct the #300 series intermediate courses, which are one day in length. These courses are available to meet the needs of workers and employers who would like to benefit from the Global OSHA curriculum, but are unable to attend multi-day courses. The topics for these courses include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Safety and Health Management Systems
- Lockout Tagout
- Ergonomics
- Respiratory Protection

Global OSHA Training Centers conduct the #500 series trainer courses, which are three days in length. These include the trainer authorization courses, which currently include the following.

- #500 Construction Safety Trainer
- #501 General Safety Trainer

Organizations seeking to become Global OSHA Training Centers must meet the following minimum requirements.

- Permanent, physical training facilities for occupational safety and health training
- Minimum of three years of experience conducting occupational safety and health training for the public
- Qualified staff to develop and conduct occupational safety and health training
- Experience in evaluation and assessment
- Administrative infrastructure and staff
- Experience in marketing and promotion
- Executive authority and commitment
